HOUSING IS THE CURE

For the past eight years, Gina Leckron has served as the Director of Habitat for Humanity of Indiana and in that role supports the work of 58 local Habitat affiliates throughout the state. An exceptional leader and advocate for the Habitat ministry, she was selected by her peers to serve as Chair of the State Organization Alliance and is a member of Habitat for Humanity International's U. S. Policy and Mortgage Regulatory Committees.

In "Housing Is the Cure," Gina will focus on the key indicators of higher educational attainment and improved health which occur with homeownership. "Children are 116 per cent more likely to graduate from high school and go on to higher education if the family owns their own home. Fewer occurrences of asthma and allergies are reported by 80 per cent of Indiana families who own Habitat homes," she states.

"Habitat has a long history of serving as a stabilizing force for families, neighborhoods and communities," says Gina, "and I'm honored to be in southern Indiana as the Evansville affiliate prepares to celebrate its 500th home – a milestone achieved by only 25 other cities in the U. S."
