Back to Old Erie

Habitat completes its work in the neighborhood nearly 20 years later

This year, you will see our construction team and volunteer crews concentrated in the Old Erie neighborhood. Many will remember our efforts in this neighborhood which took place in 1995 during a twenty-six home blitz build.

By building twelve new homes in this area in 2014, we intend to complete the revitalization of this neighborhood that began nearly nineteen years ago.

Old Erie is the second phase of a "block by block" strategy of redeveloping neighborhoods

that suffer from long-term disinvestment in both structures and people.

By returning to this neighborhood, we look to build simple, decent homes in a way that truly maximizes impact on homebuyers and the neighborhood as a whole.

Over the next few years, Habitat has a plan to target smaller neighborhoods and work on new home construction within the context of overall community development led by other partners in the area.



Joyce Hendrix

Hearing the call to give back to the community can come at any time in life. For Joyce Hendrix, the call came early in her life, but she wanted to find a way to continue giving beyond her time. It is with this spirit she stumbled upon an opportunity that allowed her to help her neighbors in the community.

Over the years, Evansville became Hendrix’s home; a home she wanted to give back to. She began giving back as an educator for EVSC for thirty-one years and spent the last part of her career as a Physical Education teacher. Hendrix heard her call to give back to her community and it did not stop with her students.

Joyce Hendrix first became involved with Habitat for Humanity of Evansville through her church, St. Paul’s UCC. This is not a hand-out and that is what I’ve always loved,” said Hendrix. She knew her volunteer hours and support made a difference in her community, but she wanted another way to continue. Hendrix began brainstorming and along with her friend in 2013, she created a will while keeping Habitat in mind. Hendrix is a single individual and wanted to make sure her affairs were in order as well as pass along her gifts in a lasting way. With her will, she wanted to take care of her family, church and then non-profits. In order for Hendrix to leave a bequest, all she needed to do was contact the non-profit, retrieve their contact information and tax identification number.

The creation of Hendrix’s will brought her peace of mind and it became another way to help her community. “If I could pass on this gift of housing through my will, there is no better higher calling.” Joyce Hendrix continues to make a positive impact on the lives around her. The creation of Hendrix’s will has given her generous spirit power beyond her years. To be able to give back in any way has brought joy to Joyce Hendrix’s life.
