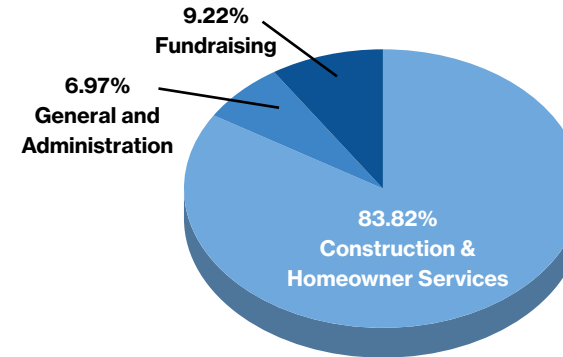

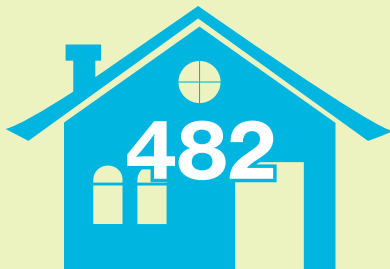

Habitat for Humanity of Evansville ReStore, LLC

The Habitat for Humanity of Evansville ReStore officially opened on August 26, 2017, and has since continued to grow. The Evansville ReStore takes donated household and industrial items and gives them a second chance at life. Donations allow the Habitat ReStore to resell high quality items at a lower price. The ReStore offers free pick-up, so items can be picked up directly from homes or businesses, making the process quick and easy. The proceeds are then used to build more homes locally and, because of our faithful shoppers, the ReStore is nearing its financial goal to fully sponsor a Habitat home right here in Evansville.

The Evansville ReStore relies on a wonderful staff and hardworking volunteers. The ReStore staff is made up of six full-time employees under the leadership of manager Todd Morgan. Todd says, "The four pillars that help support this ReStore are generous donors, great customers, amazing volunteers, and dedicated staff. It is because of them the Evansville ReStore is able to further the mission and vision of Habitat here locally."

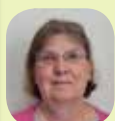
